I hope that you find this issue informative and explore evolving opportunities for our members.



The World Congress took place in Copenhagen on JULY 2-6 2023, highlighting terms such as 'archtivism', biodiversity, social inclusion, universal design & climate justice as well as investigating how architecture can contribute to the UN 17 SDGs. The world's largest architecture congress offers a



vast program of keynote dialogues, new findings presented on the science track, Next Gen sessions, workshops, exhibitions of new materials, and political talks. The packed schedule also includes the Obel Award Talks on the theme "Wellbeing Through Architecture", Velux Daylight

Talks, and Realdania Talks. In parallel to the UIA World Congress, Copenhagen has been named the World Capital of Architecture for 2023 by UNESCO, a title designated triennially to increase public awareness of sustainable architecture.

IAB Pavilion UIA Congress, Copenhagen

The IAB 25th Executive Council has achieved many remarkable and revolutionary achievements in the international arena in the last one year. The "IAB International Relations Committee" was established with a significant number of members. The committee chaired by Ar. K.M Mahfuzul Hug Zaglul, the Vice-President of International Relations, IAB and advised by Ar. Dr. Abu Sayeed M Ahmed, the former President of IAB and the current President of ARCASIA is responsible for overseeing international relations.

It was decided unanimously and on the recommendation of this committee that a pavilion will be taken at the UIA Copenhagen Congress for 3 days, through which the high standards of architecture, creativity and capabilities of our country's architects can be highlighted to the whole world. At the same time, it is also decided to showcase the world-class outsourcing capabilities and expertise of our country's young architects in the field of architecture to the architects of the world.

At present, the Global Outsourcing Market in Architecture and allied field is a billion-dollar market. Almost 1000 new architects are coming out every year from all the universities. This trend is supposed to increase exponentially in the coming years. This is a unique effort to create new job opportunities for this large number of new architects.

It is in this context that probably for the first time in the history of IAB, a pavilion of 8 meters by 6 meters is taken in Copenhagen. It should be noted here that Bangladesh is the only country in

Asia apart from China to have a pavilion there. The pavilion was officially inaugurated by the Honorable Ambassador of Bangladesh in Denmark in the presence of UIA President and many renowned architects from all over the world, the news of which was published in various Danish newspapers the next day.

The pavilion showcased our architecture to the world through posters, models and continuous digital presentations. Many Bangladeshi architects participated in this congress organized till 7th of July.

# IAB SIGNED A MOU WITH THE AIM OF COLLABORATING ON GLOBAL CHALLENGES PERTAINING TO SUSTAINABLE URBANIZATION AND CLIMATE ACTION

Detailed meetings have been organized with the representatives of the Institute of Architects of different countries to develop mutual relations. As a result. Consultant of Abdullatif Al Fozan Award for Mosque Architecture of Saudi Arabia, Dr. Hani M. Al Huneidi the MOU with the Ordre National Des Architects Conseil National of the Moroccan Institute of Architects is currently in the final stages and the MOU with the L'Ordre Gabonais Des Architectes (OGA) of Gabon has already been executed. The following members of their Executive Council were present, Ar. Chakib Benabdellah, President, Ar. Aziz Mennane, Vice President, Ar. Soufiane Benajiba, Member.

The relationship with Gabon is particularly significant here as they are opening architecture departments in several of their universities and have therefore expressed interest in recruiting faculty from Bangladesh in their new departments. We hope that this will open up a large number of architects to work there and also open a new door for our architects in Africa.

Consultant of Abdullatif Al Fozan Award for Mosque Architecture of Saudi Arabia Chief Dr. Hani M. Al Huneidi detailed meetings have been held at the bilateral level with, IAB's Ar. K.M Mahfuzul Huq Zaglul, Vice President for International Affairs, and given this, our cooperation activities with Al Fojan have

already started. Based on their recommendation, Madina Development Authority contacted us, and said that a technical team of 5 members will visit Bangladesh by December this year to hire an architect from Bangladesh for the design team of Koba Mosque, the 4th holiest mosque in Islam to be built for 80 thousand people.

Apart from this, a number of Round Table Talks were organized at the UIA Pavilion, where internationally renowned architects participated on various architectural topics in the presence of President IAB and moderated by Ar. Qazi M Arif. A detailed meeting was held with Peter Oborn, President of the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA) in Copenhagen, with IAB President and Vice-President regarding mutual cooperation.

IAB presents the issue of Mutual Recognition Agreement between the members very strongly. The CAA president assured that he will start working on this soon and organized a webinar on "Making Mutual Agreement Recognition Work" on November 7th, where apart from us, architects from Australia, UK, Kenya and Fiji participated. In addition, with the aim of obtaining the equivalence of our architectural degree and accreditation around the world and working with the Canberra Accord, Dr. A committee formed under the leadership of Mahbubur Rahman and under the supervision of IAB Education

Secretary is currently working. UIA Congress council meeting was very actively participated by President and Vice President of IAB. There the President IAB gave a speech on various directions in the future management of UIA which was widely appreciated and discussed. He also spoke on behalf of Palestine as the Vice-President of the IAB in the meeting which was well received. Ar. K.M Mahfuzul Huq Zaglul, Vice-President of International Relations, and Ar. Sabrina Aftab, Secretary Seminar participated as representatives of IAB in the round table meeting on Human Rights and Community Architecture organized in Copenhagen.

In the meeting, IAB's project named 100 Homes Project for Marginalized Communities of Rural Bangladesh was presented in detail to the representatives of various countries participating in the round table and it was widely appreciated, especially Lebanon, Nepal, Egypt, India and Canada participated in the project and similar projects. Expresses

interest in doing it in different countries of the world and discusses it in detail. Besides, Executive Director of Center for Architecture and Human Rights, Mr. Graeme Bristol expressed a keen interest in the matter and expressed his desire to work together.

The IAB International Relations Committee formed a conclusion that going forwards, IAB will focus more on the developing relations with the countries of Central Asia, Middle East and Africa or with their regional associations and will sign MOUs on an individual basis with the institutes of the countries of these regions and will try to increase the relations. The current executive council feels that these areas have a lot of potential to expand the workplace for our architects. By undertaking this program, everyone's collective efforts have created an opportunity to create a friendly environment for our world-class architects.

He emphasises a sustainable and practical approach by using recycled materials and protecting locals from natural disasters. The humanitarian aspect of his work also concentrates on food security, taking people beyond the realm of architecture. His projects demonstrate a holistic approach dealing not only with shelter but also introducing alternative food security options and building awareness about social, civil and political rights. "



# THE VASSILIS SGOUTAS PRIZE FOR IMPLEMENTED ARCHITECTURE SERVING THE IMPOVERISHED: MARINA TABASSUM (BANGLADESH) AND ĐOÀN THANH HÀ (VIETNAM)



KHUDI – BARI THE MODULAR MOBILE HOUSE, designed to address housing needs for landless char dwellers as part of a climate adaptation strategy. These low-cost, durable units can be swiftly assembled and disassembled with minimal labor. Incorporating local materials and a spaceframe structure, the design marries modern innovation with traditional Bengal delta architecture. Named "Khudi Bari" meaning "tiny house," the compact 128-square-foot footprint offers elevated living to combat flash flooding, providing a culturally appropriate and resilient housing solution. The advantage of Khudi Bari is as follows:

- 1. It is a modular system. The module can be multiplied and added in case of larger spatial requirement.
- 2. An 8'X8' footprint house with two levels made with bamboo and steel cost GBP300 (BDT 35,000).
- 3. It has two levels. The lower level can be used for domestic purpose and or income generation purposes. The upper level is planned as a sleeping area.
- 4. Two levels can have added advantage in case of flooding.
- 5. The structure is light weight and requires minimum number of components. As such it is easy to dismantle and move in case of emergency.
- 6. It requires three people to assemble the structure in three





to four days' time.

- 7. It is easy to assemble. The main components which are steel joints are the primary investment in each modular house. In case of emergency evacuation, the only components of the house that need to be rescued and taken along are the steel joints in order to build a house in a different location.
- 8. The bamboo arms of the structure can be easily replaced in case of decay or infestation.
  9. The steel joints can be handed down from one generation to the next as inheritance which is a cultural practice in these regions.
  10. Mobility of the house give the dwellers the flexibility and
- freedom to move from one place to another in search of better life and living.
- 11. The modular house can be upgraded from bamboo to wood

or steel depending on affordability of the owner. Similarly, the façade materials and design are left to the owner's preference and aspiration.

This modular mobile house shows promise in addressing climate challenges and offers a versatile solution transcending geographical limitations. Its potential extends to flood-prone northern districts, providing resilience during flash flooding. The project's first phase involved constructing and testing the modular houses under FACE (Foundation for architecture and community equity). FACE is now collaborating with various agencies to deploy these units on the ground, starting with donations to assist landless individuals. This initiative aims to gather feedback on usage and experiences, informing further design enhancements.





# THE ROBERT MATTHEW PRIZE FOR SUSTAINABLE AND HUMANE ENVIRONMENTS: HONORABLE MENTION JALAL AHMED BANGLADESH

#### **DISAPPEARING LANDS**

Supporting Communities Affected by River Erosion

Practical Action Bangladesh has launched the "Disappearing Lands" project to aid communities affected by flood and river erosion. The project, supported by the Big Lottery Fund (BLF) of the United Kingdom and Practical Action, aims to develop cluster villages and multipurpose shelters for vulnerable populations in the region.

J.A. Architects Ltd. provided design consultancy for the project, ensuring self-sufficiency for the communities involved. Village layouts were based on local traditions, with houses clustered around courtyards serving as centers for communal activities. Each cluster

accommodates 10 households, complete with separate baths, latrines, and livestock sheds.

The project, funded with a \$1.9 million grant on a cost-sharing basis, integrates various elements to support community resilience, including community halls, schools, mosques, and shops. Innovative solutions such as cropping on unfertile sandbars and floating gardens have been adopted to address resource limitations and enhance livelihoods.

Overall, the project showcases a comprehensive, integrated, and participatory disaster risk reduction model, facilitating the resettlement and livelihood restoration of affected communities.

Outcome of the project:

- The capacity of communities and support Institutions enhanced to incorporate disaster Mitigation strategies into natural resources Management and planning
- Unemployed and low-income men and women benefit through

improved income and employment opportunities through alternative livelihood options

- Disadvantaged men, women and children get improved access to basic services
- Disadvantaged men, women and children benefit from improved awareness and ability to articulate their civil and political rights.

The "Disappearing Lands" project sets a remarkable precedent for disaster-prone areas across Bangladesh. Its inclusive approach, engaging communities from the project's conceptualization to its implementation, serves as a beacon of inspiration. By providing sustainable housing solutions and integrating community needs, this model offers a blueprint for aiding homeless disaster-affected populations nationwide. It demonstrates the power of collective action in fostering resilience and rebuilding lives in the face of adversity.





# 2023 FRIENDLY AND INCLUSIVE SPACES AWARDS HONORABLE MENTIONS (NEW BUILDINGS): SHAH MUHAMMAD MOHSHIN KHAN MAUSOLEUM



Honourable mention - New Buildings "Shah Muhammad Mohshin Khan Mausoleum", by Ar. Md. Sharif Uddin Ahammed (Bangladesh)

The project is the ancestral Mausoleum (Dorgah) in Hijuli, Manikgong. The Dargah aims to reminisce the memory of the "Pir" and develop an institution for exercising Islamic Knowledge for the betterment of society. Sufism was popular in Bengal since the eleventh Century due to the continued arrival of Sufis and their involvement in religious, missionary zeal, and humanitarian activities. The project is the Dargah for Sufi Pir of Uwaisi Tariqa, and he plays important role in spreading Islamic knowledge in the locality.

The project, 'Chandelier of Paradise', aims to connect souls with higher power through its roof, metaphorically representing the journey from earthly existence to paradise. Inspired

by Sultani period mosques and tombs, the Dargah integrates local culture and resources into its design. The 36'x36' square plan, inspired by traditional Bengal huts, creates an intimate scale. The structure features 36 circles on the ceiling and reinvented repetitive turrets on the side elevations for natural lighting and ventilation. Utilizing red bricks from nearby fields, the Dargah achieves uniformity and iconic status. It serves as a space for Islamic discussions and community decisions, attracting participation from all genders and ages, especially during Urus festivals. 


### THE XXIXTH UIA GENERAL ASSEMBLY HAS ELECTED A NEW COUNCIL FOR THE 2023-2026 TERM



## PROCEEDINGS RELATED TO FORMATION OF **BBRA**



The Housing and Building Research Institute (HBRI), under the guidance of the Ministry of Housing and Public Works, has initiated the process of forming the Bangladesh Building Regulatory Authority (BBRA) in coordination with relevant stakeholders. On August 20, 2023, a pivotal meeting was held under the chairmanship of the Director General of HBRI, gathering all stakeholders to discuss the formation of BBRA. During the meeting, participants provided recommendations and it was proposed that professional organizations submit their opinions and suggestions in written form. Preliminary proposals have been shared with members, and their opinions, recommendations, and suggestions have been solicited. Based on the feedback received, the final recommendations will be prepared and forwarded to the Director General of HBRI. Steps are already being taken to ensure the proper implementation of these

recommendations.

This collaborative effort aims to strengthen building regulations and enhance the built environment in Bangladesh, reflecting the collective expertise and insights of all stakeholders involved.



In a remarkable act of social responsibility, Engr. Shamsul Alam has joined IAB's 100 home program to tackle housing challenges in marginalized communities. During the initial phase, the engineer conducted surveys in Kachua, Sundarbans, and Ghesha, witnessing the harsh realities of poverty and suffering.

Observing the detrimental effects of waterlogging on local



infrastructure, especially vulnerable temporary shelters (VITIs), the engineer was inspired to seek innovative solutions for enhanced durability and resilience.

Back in Dhaka, he conducted a small-scale experiment mixing mud and straw cement. Despite a mishap where both pots were left out in the rain, the straw and cement mixture remained intact, offering hope for a cost-effective and durable foundation solution for VITI's (BANGLA TEXT). Looking ahead, Mr. Alam aims to further refine their approach and extend research to other soil types. This initiative underscores the potential of grassroots innovations to make a significant impact on community development and resilience.

### 100 HOMES **DESIGN MEETING**





The design team for the 100 HOMES PROJECT met at the IAB Centre 5th September. This time, the team was tasked with designing 21 houses for the marginalized villagers in Bhola.

#### 100 HOMES KACHUA SURVEY

IAB Social Responsibility
Committee is making strides in
housing development for rural
marginal people with a project to
construct 100 homes across 8
regions in Bangladesh. With
each house cost at
approximately 2 lakh takas,
funding is sourced from IAB
members and other avenues,
potentially increasing the number
of homes based on available
funds.

Currently, the focus is on constructing seven houses in remote villages of Kachua Upazila and the Sundarbans area. Under the supervision of Ar. Shibu Bosu from Khulna University's Architecture Discipline, in collaboration with Prof. Dr. Sheikh Serajul Hakim and three master's level students, this project aims to address rural housing needs in the Southern part of Bangladesh.





### 100 HOMES **BHOLA SURVEY**

A team of 28 architects and multiple engineers is heading to Bhola to survey 40 houses, facilitated by Sheltech Ceramics Ltd. Previous trips to Kochua saw participants covering their own expenses, but this time, the entire trip, including travel, accommodation, and meals, is generously covered by Sheltech

Ceramics Ltd. The Bhola project is led by Ar. Dr. Masud Ur Rashid, Chairman, the Department of Architecture, Southeast University. Plans are already in motion for the next project site in Moheshkhali, Cox's Bazar, scheduled for November 2023.





## IAB DELEGATION MEETS WITH DEPUTY GOVERNOR OF BANGLADESH BANK







Recognizing the potential for fruitful collaboration, the Deputy Governor expressed the importance of maintaining regular communication between Bangladesh Bank and IAB. Both parties agreed to further discussions and to consider signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to formalize their partnership. The meeting concluded with a shared commitment to explore avenues for joint initiatives that would benefit both the architectural community and the objectives of Bangladesh Bank.







Fahim Ashab Faroquee from Chittagong University of Engineering and Technology (CUET) and Esrat Jahan from Bangladesh University of

Engineering and Technology (BUET) were awarded silver and bronze respectively, in the 'Thesis of the Year' category at the 20th Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA) Congress, held on Boracay Island in the Philippines. Fahim received the silver medal in the ARCASIA 'Thesis of the Year' category for his thesis titled 'Echoes of Replenishment', which focused on optimizing large spaces.


### **OBITUARY**
