He also laid the importance of modernization of the Fire Service and Civil Defense Directorate in this regard. He also suggested the authority for improving and modernizing shelter homes to tackle the post-quake situation. # CAA Conference Designing City Resilience' Summit at RIBA, London

The 50th Anniversary of the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA) was celebrated at the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) in London from 15th to 18th June, 2015. The occasion was marked by an eventful International Summit on "Designing City Resilience" on the 16th and the 17th. The event also included a Council meeting and a Council dinner on the 15th and a General Assembly on the 18th.

The summit incorporated 36 international speakers who shared ideas on city resilience through 16 sessions. Among the speakers were experts involved in the design and construction, development and infrastructure, city leadership and governance, insurance and finance, and technology and communications of a city. There was also a Designing City Resilience panel that discussed, through 6 panel sessions, the key themes of City Resilience. The themes were:

- Defining urban resilience
- Designing places for people
- The role of technology in improving resilience
- · City Resilience: Vision, strategy, barriers and lessons so far
- Creating long-term value through innovative city investment strategies
- Climate Change and shocks to the system


The event also included three case study presentations on Barcelona, Bristol and New York and how these cities are addressing their own challenges to improve their well-being. The presentations emphasized on the policies that these cities are establishing in order to achieve their goals on improving their infrastructure as well as the social and economic consistency.

The summit was highlighted by an exciting City Resilient Challenge as a participatory way of bringing architects from around the world to propose strategies addressing the challenges faced by 11 international cities: Austin, Barcelona, Bristol, Chennai, Glasgow, Manchester, Melbourne, New York, Rio de Janeiro, Rotterdam and Vejle. Based on the challenges these cities faced, four composite cities--Emerging City, Mega City, City Region, and Innovative City—were formed with a Mayor assigned to each. They collaborated with attendees from around the world to establish strategies addressing the issues which were then presented by the Mayors at the end of the summit.

On behalf of the CAA, the RIBA organized a competition which aimed to 'highlight the diversity of challenges, opportunities and responses faced by cities throughout the world, from large nation states to small island communities'. The entries were displayed at the RIBA headquarters during the event and the winners were announced at the RIBA President's Reception on 16th June. A Gala dinner, hosted by the Worshipful Company of Chartered Architects in collaboration with the RIBA, was held on the 17th and a CAA General Assembly marked the end of the event on 18th June.







#### **CAA Commemorative Book**

The Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA) introduced a commemorative publication--'ARCHITECTURE IN THE COMMONWEALTH'— as part of its Golden Jubilee celebration at the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA), London in June 2015. The book was launched at the CAA General Assembly and Conference during the event.

The book contains articles on the CAA and its achievements along with congratulatory messages from eminent figures. The 'CAA chronicles' section highlights the starting of CAA, its publications so far, the list of CAA Presidents, and all the General Assemblies that have been held since its beginning, including the one held in Dhaka, Bangladesh in 2013. The book also lists the member country profiles as well as the profiles of the CAA Council just before the latest election, which include Ar. Mubasshar Hussain as the immediate past president and Ar. Jalal Ahmed as the Vice President Asia Alternate.

As part of the commemoration, the publication also highlights some significant architectural works from the member countries. From Bangladesh, Ar. Muzharul Islam's works, including the Art College in Dhaka, Chittagong University, Jahangirnagar University, National Library, and Joypurhat Housing, have been featured as outstanding architectural examples of all time. Moreover, pictures of the National Institute of Public Administration (NIPA), by Ar. Mazharul Islam and the Friendship Centre by Ar. Kashef Mahboob Chowdhury have been included in the book.

This commemorative publication of the CAA is a useful source of information about the architectural profession in the Commonwealth. It provides reference material on professional bodies and other related organisations involved in the construction industry, architectural education, and cross border recognition of qualifications.

# Ar. Jalal Ahmed Elected as the Vice President Asia of CAA


The Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA) has elected Ar. Jalal Ahmed from Bangladesh as the Vice President Asia for a 3-year term, starting from 2016. He was an IAB-nominated candidate and has been elected unopposed. Ar. Jalal Ahmed is also the Vice President (National Affairs) of IAB and the immediate past Vice President Asia Alternate of CAA. He has also served as the Honorary Secretary of Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA) during 2009-10 & as the General Secretary of IAB during 2011-14. The immediate past Vice President Asia was Kalim A. Siddiqui from Pakistan.





# **Charles Correa**

[1930-2015]



IAB deeply mourns the demise of the eminent architect Charles Correa, who died on 16th June 2015 in Mumbai following a brief illness. Charles Correa was an Indian Architect, urban planner and activist. An influential architect credited for the creation of modern architecture in post-Independence India, he was celebrated for his sensitivity to the needs of the urban poor and for his use of traditional methods and materials.

Charles Mark Correa was born on 1st. September, 1930, in Secunderabad, India. Correa began his higher studies at St. Xavier's College, Mumbai at the University of Bombay (now Mumbai) and went on to study at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor (1949-53) and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in Cambridge, Massachusetts (1953-55).

He established his own Mumbai based professional practice in 1958. He designed the Mahatma Gandhi Memorial that same year, aged just 28, before going on to work on projects including the State Assembly for Madhya Pradesh (1967), the Bharat Bhavan arts complex in Bhopal (1982), the National Crafts Museum in New Delhi (1990) and the British Council building in Delhi

He also completed housing projects in Delhi, Bombay, Ahmedabad, Bangalore, while his most recent designs include Toronto's Ismaili Centre, the Brain Science Centre at MIT and the Champalimaud Centre for the Unknown in Portugal. In 1990 he became the third recipient of the Gold Medal from the International Union of Architects, while his many other accolades include the Aga Khan Award for Architecture, Japan's Premium Imperiale and the Padma Vibhushan – India's second-highest civilian award.

He designed the distinctive buildings of National Crafts Museum, New Delhi (1975–1990), Bharat Bhavan, Bhopal (1982), Jawahar Kala Kendra (Jawahar Arts Centre), in Jaipur, Rajasthan (1986–1992), British Council, Delhi, (1987–92) the McGovern Institute for Brain Research at MIT, Boston (2000–2005) and the City Centre (Salt Lake City, Kolkata) in Kolkata (2004). Ar. Correa also designed state-of-the-art research and development facility of Mahindra & Mahindra Ltd (Mahindra Research Valley) at Chennai, which is the epicenter of various R&D networks of Mahindra & Mahindra Ltd.

From 1970–75, he was Chief Architect for New Bombay (Navi Mumbai), an urban growth center of 2 million people across the harbour from the existing city of Mumbai. He was involved in extensive urban planning of the new city along with Shirish Patel and Pravina Mehta. Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi appointed him Chairman of the National Commission on Urbanization in 1985. In 1984, he founded the Urban Design Research Institute in Bombay, dedicated to the protection of the built environment and improvement of urban communities. During the final four decades of his life, Correa has done pioneering work in urban issues and low-cost shelter in the Third World.

One of Correa's most important later projects is the new Ismaili Centre in Toronto, Canada which is located in the midst of formal gardens and surrounded by a large park designed by landscape architect Vladimir Djurovic. It shares the site with the Aga Khan Museum designed by Fumihiko Maki.

The Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA) and the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) announced the winners of the international student competition 'Visualising the Future of the City' at a reception on the evening of 16th June 2015. The announcement coincided with the first day of the international summit 'Designing City Resilience' that the RIBA hosted in London in the year that the CAA celebrates its Golden Jubilee.

The topic of the competition was inspired by the work of the UK Government's Foresight Future of Cities project and it attracted 33 entries from countries as far afield as Japan, Canada, South Africa, and Colombia, to name a few. The judging panel included CAA President Rukshan Widyalankara, RIBA President Stephen Hodder, and RIBA Vice President International Peter Oborn.

The third prize was awarded to the entry 'Resuscitating Dhaka' submitted jointly by Bin Sayeed Bakhti and Manal Anis of BUET. Bakhti and Anis explained that their entry "speaks of a time in the not too distant future where Bengalis, after witnessing self- destruction reach a saturation point, will turn around and, against all odds, survive. The city will, ultimately, experience a harmony between legalized slums and contemporary architecture; farm lands and urban areas; loops of flyovers, roads and restored water channels; globalization and age-old cultural norms."

They went on to add that, "it was an honor and a privilege to have received the third prize in such a prestigious competition. We would like to have this opportunity to thank the esteemed jury panel and RIBA for recognizing our work; our tutor, from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET), Mahmudul Anwar Riyaad for guiding us through the entire process and helping us come up with the best way to demonstrate and explain our vision, our advisor Dr. Zebun Nasreen Ahmed and head of the Department of Architecture, Dr. Farida Nilufar."


# Organized by National University of Singapore

# Workshop on 'Safe Sanitation For Our Habitat: Strategies For Architects' at AIUB
